## Coming to Canada!

Students in Grade 11 and 12 have had the opportunity to have Abi Pervaiz in their class – all the way from Nepal! Abi has been taking courses for the past 4 years and is hoping to graduate IN CANADA – next year! It has been a long haul for him with limited education opportunities but he has persisted despite the 12 hour time difference! Yes, he has attended live classes at midnight his time! Dedication!!!!

The “group of five” sponsors who are assisting the Pervaiz family in coming to Canada finally have the go ahead to start the paperwork – and there is lots – including raising a minimum of \$27 000 for housing and food. But there are a lot more expenses including furniture, clothing (Abi is not scared of -40!), and other expenses. Both his Mom and Dad would be looking for jobs in Edmonton once they get settled.

So why refugees? (this is the Reader’s Digest version)

Mr. Pervaiz was born in Pakistan, moved to London, met his wife, moved back to Pakistan, opened a successful grocery store and built a big house. The Islamic Madrassa expected him to donate his house and he would be rewarded by Allah. (The Pervaiz family are Christians). He refused, police wouldn’t help, house threatened to be burned, their lives were in jeopardy, no help from neighbours. Left Pakistan for Thailand but couldn’t get a interview date for refugee status for 4 years but their Visa is only good for two. In 2015 they left for Korea – couldn’t afford an extension on that Visa so headed to Nepal in 2017. They have been in limbo in the refugee camp since then waiting to find a “forever home.”
